How to organize the paper

Putting too much in one paper makes it diffuse and difficult to understand

Paper should be focused on one topic

We like to publish more, BUT to read less !!!

We all are readers ...

- 1) Figures (should be informative)
- 2) Title, Abstract, Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion
- 3) Methods, Results, Discussion, Introduction, Abstract and Title (90% of researches read only these parts)
- 4) Abstract and Figures should be understandable without reading the whole paper

No, this is a hard work .....
